
SHAINA AND BRYAN BAIRA

She completed her certification as a Movement Analyst at the Laban Institute of Movement Studies, and completed studies in religion and philosophy at the New York All Faiths Seminary International where she was ordained as an Interfaith Minister, and where she began developing MVMNT PHLOSPHY; a synthesis of movement research, spirituality and philosophical inquiry. Bryan received his BFA in dance from Wayne State University and has danced with Nicholas Leichter Dance Brian Brooks Moving Company, David Dorfman Dance and Third Rail Projects. 



DURATIONAL PERFORMER



Mary Mar better known as BGIRL MAMA is a unique and hardcore performer who happens to be a Khmer Muslimah b-girl. Born in Detroit, BGIRL MAMA grew up in a big Cambodian family of seven kids who all loved to sing and dance. And because she loved singing and performing so much, she joined her grade school choir and continued her journey in show choir & musical theatre through high school. After graduating, she began her journey in Hip Hop culture when she started breakin' (breakdancing) at the legendary St. Andrews Hall in 2001. Since then, she has performed, judged, and competed throughout the United States and Canada with her dance crews Hardcore Detroit ® and Venus Fly (a notable performance with Hardcore Detroit ®


was at the Smithsonian National Museum of African American History and Culture in 2017). In 2016, BGIRL MAMA, became part of a dance collective duo Mama2 with dancer,



choreographer, educator and activist Amirah Sackett. Mama2 has toured with Caravanserai (Midwest Arts) and Malaysia's The Get Down Session Tour (supported by the U.S Embassy).

They have also performed at Detroit's 1st Women in Hip Hop Concert (2016), Trinity International Hip Hop Festival (2019), Bates Dance Festival (2019) and more. BGIRL MAMA has also released three songs she wrote and produced: breathe, Get It, Got It, Good!, and Unicorn Alien. These songs will be featured on her upcoming self-written and self-produced debut album entitled Becoming...Unicorn Alien which is expected to be released in the 2025.

An artist of nearly 20 years, the mindset he choses to portray as an artist is one of "Well, if I want to create until I'm a pile of ash, and I do, then I better have some variety in crafts, huh?", as they work together to create something not only new, but symbiotic. Whether it be dancing on stage with well-known DJ's at festivals, painting murals throughout the city, golf-carting his way throughout festivals building an experience for the public, or creating a house in a bar that someone can reminisce on the cartoons from their childhood with a beer in hand, he is no stranger to testing himself and the limits and outlines of the projects and processes around him.

He is currently a company member and instructor with BAIRA MVMNT PHLSOPHY, with whom he has been able to travel, perform, and teach in Detroit, Texas, and New York City. Jerwaun "Renegade" Suddun, born and raised on the Eastside of Detroit and better known as 'Renegade', is the leader of the Michigan Krump Movement



TEACHING ARTIST



As a teenager growing up on the eastside of Detroit, Michael believes that dancing, specifically the Jit, saved his life. It kept him and his friends off of the streets and out of trouble.

Michael majored in dance at the Detroit High School for the Fine and Performing Arts and studied business at Wayne State University. He performed extensively inside and outside of school. He even choreographed a video for Michael Bivens' group Biv 10. After taking a hiatus from dance, Michael felt the pull to return to



his craft. Actually, it was more of a calling than a pull. He acknowledges that God has gifted him to dance and he wants to share this gift with others. It was out of this calling that Jit Masters was born.

Jit Masters is a movement designed to make the Detroit Jit known worldwide. It consists of an experienced dance crew, private one-on-one dance lessons, dance workshops, and more. The Jit has been around for a while and now it's time for the world to experience this piece of Detroit culture. Jit Masters founder, Michael "Jit Master Mike" Smith, is a dance teacher at Motor City Dance Factory, a 2021 Detroit Choice Award winner for Detroit's Favorite Jitter, and a 2024 Kresge Fellow for Dance, He resides in Detroit, Michigan with his wife, Orma, and daughters, Hailey and Jasmine. James (YAQUB) Terry, also known as Yaqub Shot Dat, is a Detroit native and graduate of Cooley High School. Deeply immersed in the city's Jit culture, Yaqub has been an active member of the Detroit dance community, performing with The Pistons Jit Performance Team, House of Jit, and Jit Masters. He has also taught Jit to children at the City of Detroit's Northwest Activity Center and has performed at major events such as Techno Fest, Tectroit, R&B Soul Fest, and Rhythm of the Feet, featuring Michael Manson.

In addition to his dance career, Yaqub is an active photographer and cinematographer. He has captured the essence of Detroit's Krump and Jit scenes and has worked closely with BAIRA MVMNT PHLOSPHY to create compelling visual content. Yaqub is a key player in the film industry, contributing to Detroit's emerging status as a new movie capital. With a secured distribution deal, his films are now available on major platforms such as Apple TV, Android TV, Fire TV, and Amazon.

A member of Rhythm Attack (Hong Kong) from 2006. 2019, a current member of Motion Disorderz (U.S.A.), his beginnings as a dedicated dancer began in the year 2000 in the art of Breaking. As part of Awesome Style Konnection, a dance group based out of his hometown, Chicago, he became versed in

multiple disciplines of dance/movement.


Some highlights of his career are having been a regular performer for the NBA's Chicago Bulls & Milwaukee Bucks and having won numerous competitions in different dance disciplines.King has taught



courses and workshops around the world tailored towards the art of breaking, other art forms from the U.S.A and creative movement in general. Having been described as having an "unorthodox style of dancing," he draws on his love of music, dance, martial arts, and creative movement to further develop himself and others as well-rounded and unique dancers.

King's passion for dance to connect people from various backgrounds led to him cofounding "Breakin' The Law: International Festival of Urban Movement." Started in 2004 at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, "BTL" ran for 11 consecutive years and grew to be the largest annual urban dance festival in the state of Wisconsin and one of the biggest in the history of the Midwest. Breakin' The Law's emphasis on community, shared learning, and the impact of Hip-Hop as a connective culture haveinspired others to do the event on a global level with quali ers having been hosted in Hong Kong, Capetown, Panama City, Manila, and various cities in the U.S.A.

King is also a professional DJ and event MC; known as King G.N.S. (pronounced "Genius"). Through his multiple talents and experiences, he expresses "I've learned to not be a great dancer or dance teacher. Instead I've learned to be great at self-expression and sharing my passion with the world



VIM VIGOR

is a physical dance theatre company under the artistic direction of Shannon Gillen and Jason Cianciulli. Founded as a collaborative research platform, VIM brings together innovative artists to create original, cutting edge, interdisciplinary and cinematic works testing the reaches of physical actors, theatrical dancers and dance plays. In tandem with building new creations for the company, VIM choreographs virtuosic dance works and directs dance theater pieces for companies, universities, and platforms around the world, most recently in Iceland and Germany and in 2025 VIM will travel for commissions in Ireland and Spain. VIM established an education platform in 2015 dedicated to supporting the professional lives of artists of all ages and backgrounds with ongoing classes, workshops, and annual winter / summer intensives.
